

LSE Master's Scholarships for Global Programmes Graduates

Each year, LSE offers a number of scholarships to exceptional graduates of its Global Programmes (University of London EMFSS) who wish to pursue Master's studies at the School. All scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic merit.

LSE is a globally renowned research university based in the heart of London. Our graduate students join a diverse international community, undertake in-depth research, enhance their skillsets, and significantly boost their career prospects.

Scholarships Available

- **LSE-UoL Graduate Scholarships**
Each year, LSE awards **two to three partial tuition fee scholarships**, each worth up to £15,000, to outstanding Global Programmes graduates admitted to an LSE Master's programme.
- **David Webb Scholarship (new from 2026)**
From 2026, LSE will be launching a new scholarship to recognise the outstanding contribution made by Professor David Webb to the Global Programmes. The scholarship will be offered for a period of three years only. This prestigious award provides up to £30,000 towards tuition fees for an LSE Master's degree and is awarded annually to one outstanding Global Programmes graduate admitted to the LSE Master's programme.

Eligibility

To be eligible for either scholarship, candidates must:

- Have completed a **Global Programmes (UoL EMFSS) undergraduate degree**; and
- Have received an offer for an LSE Master's programme starting **within two years** of completing their degree.

How to Apply

If you have received an offer for an LSE Master's programme, you may apply for a scholarship by:

Application deadline:

The deadline for submitting scholarship applications is **31st July** of the year in which you plan to start your graduate studies at LSE.

LSE will review applications in **August**, once assessment results are ratified, and will confirm scholarship decisions **before the start of the LSE academic year**.
