

SIM-UB Scholarship

The SIM-UB Scholarship is a merit-based award by the Singapore Institute of Management (SIM) and the University at Buffalo (UB).

Eligibility Requirements

- Applicants must be full-time SIM-UB students in good academic standing (Min: 3.5 CGPA) at the time of application.
 - Applicants must also be accepted into the major of their programme and take a minimum of 12 credits at UB.

Tenure of Scholarship

- Valid for one semester only (Fall or Spring) in Buffalo only.
 - Non-renewable, non-transferable, and cannot be deferred.

Value of Scholarship

Each award covers:

- One semester's full-time (registered at a minimum of 12 credit hours) tuition fee waiver in UB, Buffalo campus
 - One semester's housing on-campus (equivalent to UB Residence Hall, twin sharing only)
 - Reimbursement of a round-trip economy class air ticket between Singapore and Buffalo
 - **Important Notes:**
 - The scholarship does not cover expenses related to books, comprehensive fees, student activity fees, medical insurance, food, or personal expenses.
 - Reimbursements up to a maximum amount of SGD 7,500 for the combined cost of housing and air tickets upon submission of original receipts.
 - All documentation for reimbursements will have to be submitted within a month after the end of the semester.
 - No advance payments will be made.

Terms and Conditions

- Students are required to register for courses, apply for housing, book your air ticket, and handle all other arrangements relating to your tenure at Buffalo, New York.
 - Students are required to sit for all examinations, complete all registered courses within the prescribed time and conform to regulations, instructions and discipline in force for the program. These courses must be completed at UB's Buffalo campus only. This will constitute satisfactory completion of the courses.
 - Should students (a) drop or resign from any registered courses before satisfactory completion, (b) fail any of the required examinations, (c) change the major of study, and/or (d) withdraw from the degree program, students will be required to reimburse SIM and UB for the total scholarship amount applied toward the course tuition fees. This reimbursement obligation applies even if the scholarship funds were paid directly to the institution on your behalf rather than disbursed to you personally. The full amount must be repaid within three (3) months from the date of the triggering event described above. In cases of demonstrated financial hardship, SIM and UB will work with you to establish a reasonable repayment arrangement, where necessary.
 - The scholarship may not be held concurrently with any other award from SIM.
 - The scholarship awarded is valid for the SIM-UB program commencing in the relevant academic semester only and may not be deferred.
 - SIM-UB reserves the right to withdraw or suspend the scholarship at any time, if, in its opinion, your conduct or performance has not been satisfactory. SIM-UB's decision in this respect shall be final.
