

UoL-SIM Regional Centre Master's Scholarship 2026/2027

What is the award?

We are announcing **one University of London – SIM Regional Centre Master's Scholarship** comprising tuition fees up to a maximum of £30,000 for a full-time one-year taught master's degree at a University of London federation member, for September 2026 entry.

Who can apply?

Any graduate or graduating student awarded/due to be awarded **First Class/Upper Second Class Honours** within the last four years, regardless of nationality, who has completed a **University of London undergraduate degree at SIM in Singapore**, and who holds a conditional or unconditional **offer of master's study, full-time and one year, at a University of London federation member** for the 2026/27 academic year. What are the criteria?

See above. Please note that for graduating students, marks must be confirmed by **14 August 2026**.

Personal statement of no more than 750 words setting out the following:

- Reasons for choice of master's programme
- Plans for career in the 5 years following completion of the degree.
- How you have contributed to student life at Singapore Institute of Management
- How will you contribute to both UoL and SIM before, during and after your master's study?
- How will you use your learning to contribute to your workplace and community upon completion of your Master's?

Applications will be assessed on both academic merit and on past and potential future contributions to University of London and SIM.

Shortlisted applicants may be invited to a **scholarship selection interview** conducted via Microsoft Teams video call, and if so, will be informed by email accordingly. The scholarship application will be withdrawn if the applicant is unable to attend any scheduled selection interview(s) without valid reason(s).

What are the conditions?

The award is tenable for the 2026/27 academic year and is not transferable to other years.

The award is for one year's full-time study on the programme and at the institution specified through the award process.

The award covers tuition fees for the programme (up to a maximum of £30,000); all other expenses will need to be met from alternative sources.

Scholars are required to act at all times in conformity with the student code of conduct as set out by the chosen University of London federation member. If they fail to comply with the code, the University and SIM reserve the right to withdraw the scholarship.

Both the University and SIM will contact the scholarship recipient before, during and after their study to secure their engagement in outreach and development activities.

This may include (for SIM):

- published interviews and testimonials, speaking at events including SIM-UoL Programme Briefings, Open Days and Achievers' Events, mentoring other students following your graduation, or other forms of engagement.

- The University of London will require the scholarship recipient to take part in an in-person interview which will be recorded and published online. (See [here](#) for past examples).
- The University of London will pass on details of successful candidates to colleagues in the University of London's Development Office.
- Further engagement by mutual agreement

We will not make onerous demands, and specific points of engagement will be by mutual agreement; but we will expect from the scholarship recipient as an active member of our worldwide Alumni Network, some ongoing interaction with the University and SIM.

The University of London and SIM reserve the right not to award any scholarship. The decision of the selection committee is final. There is no appeals process.
