SIM-UB
Celebrates its
20th Anniversary!

he first classes of the SIM-UB Undergraduate Program were held on May 31, 2004. The initial intake of approximately fifty students who joined the program that summer were all in one major: Bachelor of Science in Business Administration. There were four instructors and one Resident Director, who also served as academic advisor and instructor of the freshman composition class. It was a modest beginning, but one that was filled with enthusiasm for future growth. It was, after all, the first program of its kind in Singapore: a program in which students could earn a degree from a reputable American research university—The University at Buffalo, The State University of New York—entirely in Singapore through its academic partnership with the Singapore Institute of Management.

In the summer of 2024, we celebrated the 20th Anniversary of the SIM-UB undergraduate program. Since 2004, there have been many significant milestones and developments along the way. Six additional majors (Communication, Psychology, Economics, Sociology, International Trade, and Geographic Information Science) have been launched, as well as double major and double degree combinations, and minors in each of the disciplines offered. Since 2005, with the election of the first SIM-UB Student Council, generations of students have contributed to the growth and continuation of a vibrant academic community, with a student body that is Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive, and Enthusiastic (WISE!). The UB Bound program, first launched in 2005, has sent over 1000 students to the home campus for one or more semesters, offering them the opportunity for an enriching study abroad experience.





Over 200 visiting faculty members from the home campus have come to teach for a semester or more in Singapore, providing them with the opportunity to engage in an enriching cross-cultural teaching experience, and in many cases, contributing a global perspective to their research activities. In 2023, SIM achieved the highest level of accreditation within the private education sector in Singapore, the EduStar rating from the Committee for Private Education. Moreover, in the spring of 2024, SIM-UB underwent a rigorous site visit from our regional accrediting agency in the United States, The Middle States Commission on Higher Education, which described the SIM-UB program as "exemplary". And, most importantly, over 6000 students have graduated with University at Buffalo degrees, enabling the establishment of a robust and active SIM-UB Alumni Association. For students who join SIM-UB, a lifetime of camaraderie and networking awaits after graduation, now that our program has reached the mature age of twenty! And, by the way, after these twenty years, SIM-UB is still the only program in Singapore in which students can earn a degree from a prestigious American research university entirely in Singapore!

To mark the auspicious and illustrious 20th anniversary of SIM-UB, a gala dinner was held at Sheraton Towers on July 12. The event was attended by President Satish Tripathi of University at Buffalo, Ms. Euleen Goh, Chairman of the SIM Board of Directors, and numerous other dignitaries from the UB and SIM campuses, as well as alumni, faculty, and staff of SIM-UB

We are looking forward to the continued success of the SIM-UB partnership in the years to come.

Faculty Accomplishments

Dr. Blake Hendrickson and Students Conduct Research, Present Findings, and Publish Paper

After arriving in Singapore in 2016 to teach for the UB-SIM Communication Department Dr. Blake Hendrickson noticed that many students used their smartphones as a public speaking aid. This was a relatively recent phenomenon and led him to question if smartphone use was impacting audience perceptions of speaker credibility and persuasion, two commonly desired professional speaking outcomes. Four communication undergraduate students (pictured from left: Lucas Goh, Joshua Jun Kit Lee, Janice Prasetio, and Ananyaa Kashyap) formed an Experiential Learning Network (ELN) mentored research project team and helped design an experiment, produce video vignettes, collect data with UB students and SIM-UB faculty/staff, analyze data, and present findings at UB Open Day 2022. Later Lucas Goh continued with the project and contributed to writing and publishing the 2024 article "Audience perceptions of a speaker who uses a smartphone as a public speaking aid: An experimental video vignette investigation" in the journal Mobile Media and Communication.

SIM-UB Graduation 2024

The University at Buffalo, The State University of New York, awarded a total of 447 bachelor's degrees in the commencement ceremony at the Singapore Institute of Management on July 11, 2024. The degrees were conferred by UB President Satish K. Tripathi and Vice Provost for International Education, Dr. Nojin Kwak. This ceremony marked the 14th time President Tripathi has officiated the graduation in Singapore, underscoring UB's dedication to the SIM-UB academic partnership. This program enables students to earn a degree from a highly respected American research university while benefiting from Singapore's dynamic and diverse educational environment. With this class, the SIM-UB alumni community in Singapore has grown to over 6,000 graduates, adding to UB's global network of more than 293.000 alumni.

The degrees conferred included 83 Bachelor of Science degrees in Business Administration, 8 in Geographic Information Studies, 108 Bachelor of Arts degrees in Communication, 105 in Psychology, 67 in Sociology, 17 in Economics, and 14 in International Trade. In addition, 8 graduates earned double degrees, while 36 received double majors.

The academic performance of SIM-UB students continues to be exceptional. In the class of 2024, 325 graduates, or 72.7% of the class, finished with Latin honors, including 79 Summa Cum Laude (GPA of 3.75 or better), 134 Magna Cum Laude (GPA 3.50 - 3.74), and 112 Cum Laude (GPA 3.20 - 3.49). This outstanding achievement is an indication of the excellent quality of the SIM-UB student body and the hard work that they devote to their studies. It also reflects the excellent quality of the highly interactive, student-centered, and experiential education that they receive in the SIM-UB program.

The graduation delegation included President Tripathi and Dr. Nojin Kwak, along with special guests celebrating the 20th program anniversary: Dean Robin Schulze, Dean Ananth Iyer, and Dean Kemper Lewis. The delegation also included Dr. Kevin McKelvey, Ms. Sherene Milizia, Mr. Wei Loon Leong, Ms. Yuke Tjandra, Ms. Kandis Pogoda, Professor Jared Aldstadt, Professor Kristen Schultz Lee, Professor Mark Frank, and Professor Aisling Winston. Valedictorians representing their graduating classes were as follows: Ms. Kezia The Herlambang (BAC) and Mr. Darrel Ang Yue Jun (GIS).

On behalf of UB and SIM, we extend our heartfelt congratulations to the Class of 2024 and wish them continued success in their future endeavors.

SIM-UB Scholarship Spring 2024

The SIM-UB program offers two merit-based scholarships each academic year (fall and spring) to deserving students, who represent the program as our student ambassadors to the home campus in Buffalo. The scholarship provides for tuition and fees, as well as housing and transportation (up to S\$7500).

I fulfilled my decade-long dream in the final semester of my undergraduate life—to attend university in the U.S.. This past spring, it all turned into a reality. With a heart filled with anticipation, I took off to NY, UB Bound.
